2011 HEATING & COOLING INCENTIVE Exceeds Program Targets

The 2011 initiative that ran from January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011 exceeded the targets established by the Ontario Power Authority. The program was a significant contributor to local distribution company's meeting their energy conservation targets.

And the 2012 initiative is off to a good start, so far we are at 15% towards the target if the pending and submitted submissions are included.
